#### **Report from the Virtual Synod Assembly 2020**

We are grateful to have had the privilege to serve as Allegheny's representatives to the Northeast PA Synod Assembly. We also were the representatives at the 2018 Assembly and the two could not have been more different in form. While the 2018 Assembly was held inside a

hockey arena in Wilkes-Barre, as you might guess this year's event was virtual, courtesy of Zoom and some special software from Lumi for online voting and assembly documents.

It was a difficult year to attempt the first virtual synod assembly because the election of a new bishop for a 6-year term was a main agenda topic. However, the online technology worked quite well, with only minor glitches - we all have quite a bit of experience with that this year. The online voting process also proceeded quite well and perhaps even better than the 2018 in person event, when there was hand tabulating, yellow, blue and green paper for ballots to keep straight, etc. It was a very manual and time-consuming process and may all future assemblies use some form of online voting and document distribution.

As well as the 2020 assembly went, it was still missing the opportunity to meet others from around the synod and have conversations. That is something truly special about the live gatherings, as all who have attended them will tell you. Those interactions are quite difficult to duplicate online.

Throughout the four days, time was taken for worship and for one ministry sharing video each session from across the synod. One of the four videos this year highlighted Allegheny's own Interwoven ministry and it was a great overview of the goals and structure of that ministry. It made us proud to be from Allegheny. A touching moment from the 2018 Assembly was watching many representatives from the Hmong congregation up on the podium, being welcomed officially into the Northeast PA synod, and getting a chance to tell their story. Allegheny continues to be a vital part of this synod.

The election of the bishop was quite a process, but through it, the voting members at the assembly got a chance to see videos of the final candidates answering questions put together by a synod committee. The questions and the candidate's thoughtful answers made it possible to discern what their goals for the synod would be and what their strengths are. Each of the final 7 candidates brought something different to the table, so the process succeeded in providing diversity of choices. Broadly you could identify candidates that were "stay the course" and those who were ready to lead the synod through significant revitalization. If you are interested, much of proceedings including these candidate videos are on the synod website.

As the ballot process continued and the number of candidates was reduced, it was clear that the assembly voting members were very closely split between "stay the course" and "revitalization". In the end, Pastor Christopher deForest was selected as the next bishop. It is up to all congregations in the synod to help Bishop-elect deForest find the path to revitalize the synod where it is necessary and stay the course where that is the appropriate choice. As a sidenote, one of the first jobs as a voting member was to attend a training class to help members get used to the technology to be used for this assembly. It was Pastor deForest who led the training, in his capacity of a member of the assembly planning team. You could tell that he is a caring and patient person, wanting to make sure that all were comfortable with the new technology so that they could fully participate, even when the fourth person in a row asked for an explanation of how to connect up the audio. When he addressed the assembly after the election was finalized, he seemed genuinely excited to get going with business of the synod.

Finally, the end of the assembly belonged to Bishop Zeiser. He has served two terms, plus a few extra months in this unusual year. He was overcome with emotion in his final address to the assembly, especially when it came to thanking his family for being supportive of him while he was busy tending to synod business. He seemed to be happy, sad, anxious, grateful and exhausted all at the same time as he could finally see the next part of his journey - retirement.

In October, expenses exceeded income by \$8500. Giving again was considerably lower than pre-pandemic. Expenses were higher than expected. The good news is that November began with one family's annual gift of \$7000 as you can see above.

The General Fund checking account balance stands at \$16,600 compared to \$4300 at this time in 2019. In order to maintain this lead, we will need a big December like we enjoyed in "normal" years.

For the first ten months of 2020, income is still ahead of expenses by \$4600, but at the end of August it was ahead by \$24,000.

Here is an HVAC loan update. We have a 36 month loan of \$20,000 at a 2% rate on which in February we started paying \$572.85 per month. These figures are not included in the General Fund figures above. As of the date of this report, we have made November's payment and the HVAC Fund has enough money to make payments for the next four months. However, giving to the HVAC Fund has practically dried up since May. The principle balance stands at approximately \$14,500.

### Family Advent Worship Series

Celebrate the birth of Jesus, the Light of the world, with this Arise and Shine Family Advent Worship Series. Each week individuals and families, children and adults, will come together to worship in an informal setting. We will learn that Jesus came to be our Light in this dark and sin-filled world. Healed by his forgiveness, we reflect the light of his love. When Jesus returns, we will live forever with him, shining like stars in his presence. The order of service each week includes the lighting of the Advent wreath, hymns, special responses for children, prayers, a message for children and adults, a family craft project and discussion questions for a family conversation.

**Week 1: Rising Light** (Isaiah 60:1-2): Living in the light of Jesus, we prepare to celebrate his birth. We repent of our sins and put away the works of darkness as we walk in Jesus' light. Those attending the service will make wooden spoon Christmas light magnets.

**Week 2: Reflected Light** (Zechariah 9:14, 16): During Advent, and throughout the year, we reflect the light of Jesus so that others will see his love in our words and actions. Filled with Jesus' love and light, we shine like jewels in a crown! Those attending the service will create jeweled paper crowns.

**Week 3: Healing Light** (Malachi 4:2): With repentant joy we anticipate the birth of our Savior, the Sun of Righteousness. Jesus healed many people during his earthly ministry. When he died and rose from the dead, he brought us peace and healing through the forgiveness of sins. Those attending the service will make a mini-first-aid kit.

**Week 4: Eternal Light** (Daniel 12:1-3): We will soon celebrate Jesus' birth and we also look forward to his Second Advent when he returns on the Last Day. On that great day we will be raised in glory to live with him forever. We will shine like stars in the light of his presence! Those attending the service will create craft stick star ornaments.

Some have returned to their buildings to worship but without singing or any personal contact and with limited numbers of folks allowed to come together. Most continue to find other ways to gather as the body of Christ. Some are meeting outside, many are meeting virtually, some reaching out through phone calls and/or mailings. We continue to worship and serve in Jesus' name by whatever means we feel are safe and meaningful for people. We are reminded daily that we are called to love our neighbor every time we put on a mask for the protection of others.

Most of our WBMD events have been cancelled but we are still doing ministry together. Please continue to lift up our pastors, ministry leaders and congregations of the WBMD in prayer. **Be well... Be safe... Be blessed.** 

#### Important Update on Worship Services Beginning November 29

Greetings to all. We pray that this message finds you well.

Last week we notified you of a revised worship schedule beginning November 29, 2020. This decision was made due to the rise in COVID-19 cases in our county and state. We also shared with you council's decision to follow the lead of the Governor Mif-flin School District (GMSD) on any potential closure of the building.

As you may know, the school district has announced that they will not return to inperson classes until December 7, 2020. With cases rising exponentially in the county and state, the district is giving everyone a chance to step back, particularly following the Thanksgiving holiday, to try and slow the spread and allow folks to quarantine after any potential exposure over the holiday.

Based on these new developments, we are still moving forward with the times of our revised schedule; however, **ALL WORSHIP SERVICES WILL BE ON-LINE ONLY FOR THE NEXT 2 WEEKS.** If the Governor Mifflin School District reopens as planned on December 7, AELC will also resume on-site worship at our 8:15 service beginning December 13. **All small group activities in the church building will also be suspended for the same period of time.** 

As a reminder, the revised worship service schedule is as follows:

- **8:15 On-line worship (Traditional) for November 29 and December 6**. After that, pending the reopening of GMSD as planned, on-site worship will resume with all existing restrictions. Physical distancing, masks, no singing or corporate response.
- **9:00** Faith Formation (on site when building reopens)
- **10:15 On-line worship (Praise)** . The online worship service will include singing, giving everyone an opportunity to sing at home.

This isn't a step that we take lightly. We all wish that we could gather together to celebrate and worship as usual. But with levels in Berks and the surrounding counties greatly exceeding that described as "substantial community spread", we feel that we are called by Christ to protect our fellow citizens both within AELC and our community, especially the "least of those" who may be more susceptible to severe illness.


